From the Rector

On Dictionary.com the adjective has 41 definitions. The noun has six more, including excellence or merit, kindness, moral righteousness, virtue. What is the word? GOOD.

It is a word we use all the time in so many ways. The season of Lent is a time when Christians should think about GOOD. As followers of Christ we train year-round to live the faith we proclaim, but we use Lent to practice with more intention, more discipline, like a training routine an athlete might undertake before a big event. I believe this is the right time to consider Christian ethics and virtues, all of which have their genesis in GOOD. When you think of your life—who you are, how you live—how do you define GOOD?

Does GOOD have to do with your grade or quality, like one would measure a report card or rate a cut of meat? Does your goodness speak of your loyalty and dedication, so that others would call you a good team player? How about thinking that you are good, because, like a ball in play, you are inbounds, on the court, inside the painted lines? Is not that the meaning when we pray, “forgive us our trespasses?” We stepped out of bounds. Sorry. What is your GOOD?

Recall the beginning of our holy scriptures. Again and again in the first chapters of Genesis, we hear a refrain; “God saw that it was good.” With each aspect of creation, God saw that it was good. As God created humankind, they were created to resemble God and God blessed them, male and female. And God saw everything that God had created and it was very good.

Here the scripture shows us a definition of good not found in the dictionary. Good is God's joy in creating, God's gladness in giving life, in making something out of nothing, order in the midst of chaos. Good is God's pleasure and delight, blessing God's own creation. To humanity God speaks directly, entrusting humans with the stewardship of God's creation, as caretakers of all that God calls good.

How are we doing? How are we reflecting God's goodness?

When the Church gathers each Sunday, we pray words like, “we have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves.” In Lent those words of confession come right at the beginning of worship, because we know we have not radiated God's goodness. Our joy has been covered over by cynicism. Our gladness and delight darkened by judgment and anxiety. This is a season for honesty to God and to

Our Worship in the Season of Lent

Lent is a season marked by repentance, with self-examination and prayer, humbling oneself before God, seeking forgiveness and return. Think of the prodigal son. To note this emphasis, worship will be muted, making a greater contrast to the joy of Easter. The confession comes at the beginning of worship. We will kneel more, both with the confession and after the Sanctus in the prayer of Great Thanksgiving. Aspects of ceremony are more subdued; the gospel will not be processed and silver vessels replaced with glass. We will use the high altar in both Church and Chapel. In this way, all the people, including the priest, face the cross as we remember the sacrifice of Christ's death and the power of his resurrection made known to us each time we celebrate the Eucharist. Make a commitment to attend worship regularly through the season of Lent and for the days of great devotion through Holy Week. This will prepare you for the fullness of joy in our celebration of the Lord's resurrection at Easter.

Sharing the Joy of Easter



Low-income Hispanic families in neighboring Kennett Square share our Christian beliefs and joy at Easter without the means for a holiday celebration. We are partnering with La Comunidad Hispana to brighten the holiday for 17 families in need—67 people, 39 of whom are children—by providing food for a healthy family meal and Easter treats to surprise and delight the children in each family. You can help this effort by:

- *providing food goods such as tortillas, rice, pasta, dried beans, canned tomatoes, and corn* to the collection bins in the Church or Parish Center.
- *contribute \$15 toward grocery gift cards for fresh foods*, specifically meat and fresh produce such as ham, pork, chicken, potatoes, lettuce, tomatoes, and other vegetables or fruit. Please make checks payable to Christ Church and mark “Easter dinner.” (Send checks to the Church Office or place yours in the offering plate.)
- *prepare a basket for a specific child*. Pick up an egg with the child’s age at Coffee Hour on **Sundays, March 7 or 14**. Return a basket with treats to the coat room in the Parish Center entrance off the circle drive.

We ask that all donations of food, funds, and treats be completed by **Monday, March 29**. Thank you for helping Christian families in our neighboring community have a family Easter celebration. Please note: This drive is separate and distinct from the Easter collection at the Preschool. We will each use different collection bins/spots as noted above.

ourselves. This is a season to be authentic and real, both about our failure and about our desire to live in the blessing of God's goodness and love. Lent is a time to pledge ourselves to those practices that ground us in God's goodness. Lent is a time to hear God's word and blessing in our weekly worship and daily discipline of scripture study, God's generative love being poured out for our salvation, redeeming us from all that is NOT GOOD. This Lent accept disciplines and practices that demonstrate your desire to serve all God's creatures, to shine in the goodness that creates compassion, generates justice, and manifests mercy. Spend the time until Easter being mindful of what it means for you to be GOOD. Practice goodness with gratitude as God delights in you. — *adapted from Ash Wednesday's Homily* *Ruth Lawson Kirk*

Girls' Choir of St. Albans Cathedral Coming to Christ Church



Christ Church is privileged to host the outstanding Girls' Choir from the Cathedral and Abbey Church of St. Alban, along with the gentlemen of the Cathedral Choir, for a one-hour concert on **Friday, April 9** at 7:30 PM in the Church. The concert will include works by Bairstow, Radcliffe, Howells, Gibbons, Handel, and Bruckner. This will be a very unique listening experience for Americans. We've certainly seen and/or heard choirs of men and boys, and we've heard mixed adult and children choirs—such as our own fabulous Cathedral Choir. And we may even have heard men and boys and girls. BUT the combination of men and girls will be a concert you won't want to miss! The girls range in age from 9 to 14, and they can maintain that pure young soprano sound that is so beautiful. Our recent visiting choirs have all been mixed choirs of either college age or high school age singers, so this will be a great treat for us. And they will make great use of our wonderful organ during the concert.

The Abbey Girls' Choir, as it is known, was founded in 1996 and is a parallel musical foundation to the Cathedral Choir of Boys and Men. The Choir sings Evensong twice weekly in the Cathedral and is regarded as one of the finest ensembles of its type in the UK.

In recent years it has given performances in Holland and Germany, broadcast Choral Evensong for Ash Wednesday live on BBC Radio 3, and has given a complete performance of J. S. Bach's *Christmas Oratorio*. The choir is critically involved with the prestigious St. Albans International Organ Festival, which takes place biennially. The Cathedral and Abbey Church of St. Alban is in Hertfordshire.

The Choir has recorded four CDs, among them a collection of English Cathedral Anthems, an album of Baroque motets featuring the renowned soprano Emma Kirkby, and a musical journey through the Church's year entitled *Pèlerinage* ("Pilgrimage"), which includes works by Francis Poulenc, Kenneth Leighton, and Benjamin Britten's famous *Ceremony of Carols*. The Choir's tour to the USA will take place from April 5-16 and will be only the second time in the group's history that it has given concerts in the USA. This is a wonderful opportunity for the choristers and the first time any of the girls will have sung in the USA. The girls of the Choir will be joined for the tour by the twelve gentlemen Lay Clerks of Cathedral Choir, professional musicians who sing the Alto, Tenor, and Bass parts at weekend services at the Cathedral. They come to Christ Church from St. Thomas' Church in Whitmarsh, PA and then continue their tour at St. Peter's Church in Morristown, NJ. *Dana Robertson*

Christ Church Receives a Grant from the Jessie Ball du Pont Fund

Christ Church has received a \$150,000 grant over three years from the Jessie Ball du Pont Fund. The grant is to support a partnership with Connecting Generations (CGI) to strengthen and expand their Creative Mentoring (CM) program for youth and adults. This partnership will dramatically increase the mentor training capacity of CGI and study the effectiveness of their training programs and methods. Christ Church's relationship with the JBDF allows it to qualify for grants it can use to support the programs of agencies with whom it has a direct connection.

The primary goal of this grant is improving the quality and the scope of training topics available to mentors, coordinators, and teachers while reducing per person costs. The CM Program is viewed as the Premier Mentor Training Program in the state, as more than 75% of the mentors in Delaware have been trained as Creative Mentors. The benefits will inure not only to CGI but many other organizations that serve youth in Delaware and rely on CGI for effective mentor training. Connecting Generations, through its Creative Mentoring Programs, partners with more than 90 site-based mentoring programs. The site-based programs include traditional school-based programs and programs in community- and faith-based after-school programs.

In addition to increasing and improving the quality and scope of training, the grant will also provide funds to increase training delivery methods. Currently Creative Mentoring's major training method is three hour in-person training. This grant will allow us to help them expand training options to include webinars, teleconference, video, and other remote training

methods. This use of technology will substantially decrease the cost for training while making the training sessions more accessible.

During just the last year, Connecting Generations has played a key role in forming collaborations between many national, state, and local programs including: the Delaware Mentoring Council, the Business Mentoring Alliance, MENTOR the National Mentoring Alliance, Big Brothers Big Sisters (BBBS), the Latin American Community Center, Delaware Futures, the Boys & Girls Clubs, Delaware Adolescent Program Incorporated (DAPI), Youth for Christ, Cathedral Choir School, Churches Take a Corner (CTAC), Hicks Anderson Community Center, Children and Families First, West End Neighborhood House, UrbanPromise, and countless schools across the state. The focus of these collaborations has been to increase the support available to youth through mentoring. Through the leadership of CGI and its collaboration with other organizations, a Mentoring Summit took place in Dover on January 26 that included more than 250 adults and 40 high school students.

Our parishioners can get involved in this project in many ways including but not limited to: becoming a mentor, being part of a pilot group to evaluate the training topics and methods, volunteering to work on the Board of CGI and/or its committees, and/or supporting the organization through donations. CGI appreciates the dedication of CCCH parishioners who have served on its board and as mentors.
