## **From the Rector: Challenging Times**

More than 100 people have signed on to the 90-Day Bible Challenge, a pledge to read the Bible cover to cover in 90 days, beginning June 1. As the date approaches, some good souls are anxious that, having made the commitment, they will not be able to comprehend what they are reading, or keep up with the commitment. I have heard others wondering how valuable it is to race through the sacred texts just to do it in 90 days.

Ted Cooper came up with this challenge from his own experience. His path was like many. Raised attending church, he rejected it as a young man but returned with his children to expose them to the Christian message. He decided (or the Spirit led him) to buy a Bible and read it through, planning it as a three-month task. While reading the prophets, he realized that he was a believer, a follower of Christ. Ted's life transformed, he finished his three-month project, and after a month's break, started again. In 2001 he introduced his plan in a class for a Presbyterian Church, and over the years other churches have taken on the challenge.

When you name a goal, it helps to have a plan and others to share in it. Ted admits those accepting the challenge will experience a range of questions and emotions, and he suggests keeping a log or journal of them. I suggest that as our 100+ persevere, we will get caught up in the sweep of salvation's history. Joan Sharp compared it to a visit to a large city, where you take the scenic tour bus to see the layout of all the sites before you dive into a few particular ones that draw you. Whether you join in the challenge or not, Christ Church cannot help but be changed by 100+ members reading the Bible. God will speak to us as we encounter the sacred text of our faith. Even more, as we gather for worship week by week, God will speak to us in the presence of God's son, Jesus, whose death and resurrection are the means for our healing and integrity, delivered in worship as the sacrament of his Body and Blood.

So here is my advice, my encouragement to you as you enter summer's leisure. Enjoy it as one of God's great blessings. Play and be refreshed. But do not neglect the call to honor God in sacred text and Sunday worship, whether here or far away. If you visit another congregation, bring their bulletin back with you. Join in the many opportunities to draw closer to God and to others in worship, fellowship, and service. Receive God's blessing so that you may be a blessing in these challenging times.

## June Outreach Collections

UrbanPromise is a ministry that equips children and youth with skills for academic achievement, life management, spiritual growth, and Christian leadership. During June, we will collect *small kitchen and bathroom cups, all purpose cleaner, dish liquid, hand sanitizer and soap, paper towels, tissues, and toilet paper* for the ministry's summer camp programs.

The YWCA Homelife Management Center provides housing, training, and counseling to support family units in preparation for their move to permanent housing. We will collect *new twin sheets, blankets, towels, shower curtains, laundry and cleaning supplies, personal care products, grocery store, Target, Kmart, and Wal-Mart gift cards, small appliances, household items, bus passes, and canned and dry food items*.

Collection bins are located in the back of the Church and in the Parish Center near the circle drive. Tax receipts are available for your records.

Come see the results of your contributions and the vision of Friendship House board and directors to serve those who need a fresh start after incarceration.

**A Time to Give Thanks:** The whole Christ Church community made possible our \$100,000 capital gift to this project. With the leadership of Linda Boyden, former real estate offices have been turned into a home. Many parishioners gave furniture, household items, and donations to fuel the effort to set up the house. Youth planted a garden, children have prepared welcome baskets, men have moved furniture, others have cleaned and arranged. In addition, parishioners serve on the Board, work on their fund-raising events, or host their own on behalf of Friendship House. We are so blessed and humbled by ongoing leadership and generosity of so many parishioners. Thank you all!

## Outreach Committee Allocations



The Outreach Committee has recently finalized their allocations for 2010. For the past two years, Outreach's primary focus has been programs that "address poverty, specifically those programs that feed, clothe, house, educate, advocate for, and offer health care for the destitute, the homeless, and the deprived." While there is a primary focus, Outreach also funds a variety of other agencies. Historically, we have attempted to allocate roughly two-thirds of our funds toward our primary focus. Each year every committee member reads and discusses every grant request, over the course of a month.

It is always hard to balance the needs of many agencies against our limited funds. In doing so, one of our primary criteria is involvement with the Christ Church community. Our Outreach funding is an extension of our church activities, helping to engage the church membership, in support of Matthew 25:31-46, "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me."

Outreach has continued to try and leverage Christ Church time and monies by partnering with the Jessie Ball du Pont Fund to seek funding for our partner agencies in the community. A successful Jessie Ball du Pont grant requires CCCH commit not only our time and talent but also additional monies for the specific grant project. These monies are separate from our annual allocation process. The prospective agency is selected through a separate grant review process. The annual allocation process sets aside money to meet this Jessie Ball du Pont Fund requirement. We just received our fourth grant. This grant is for Creative Mentoring. In the past we have received monies to help Survivors of Abuse in Recovery, Delaware Futures, and Latin American Community Center. All told, Outreach has been able to direct more than \$400,000 in Jessie Ball du Pont grants to area agencies.
