From the Rector

One day in July, I received a phone call from Cal Wick, who is participating in the 90-Day Bible Challenge. Cal and I share a common seminary in preparation for ordained ministry, and he was wondering if I had read the Bible cover to cover while at Virginia. I believe I read the Old Testament in one semester and the New Testament in another, but never like this. As Russ has been reminding the "challenged," we are reading for the sweep of the story rather than probing one passage or developing a theme. And it's wonderful.

Last year the Episcopal Church produced a study on Episcopal Identity called "Around One Table" that examined several common themes reported by stakeholders in the Church. Six themes were named as the core of our church's identity: Christ as Central, Sacramental, Incarnational, the Book of Common Prayer, Scriptural, and Pastoral. It is good to see that our Church claims scripture at the heart of our identity. The report says, "Episcopalians embrace the distinctive early Anglican heritage of presenting the scripture to the people, in the language of the people. Ordained leaders pledge that they recognize scripture to contain 'all things necessary for salvation,' and preaching is expected to draw directly upon the biblical texts read each day in worship. In the Anglican emphasis on scripture, tradition, and reason, Episcopalians rated scripture as most important."

The report went on to say we Episcopalians realize we hear a lot of scripture in our worship and say we want to be grounded in it but aren't confident we actually are knowledgeable about the texts we hear. That is why an event like the 90-Day Bible Challenge can be transformative for a parish. With so many members reading and talking about the Bible, our identity as a scriptural church is strengthened.

This September there is another chance for our members and guests in the wider community to deepen their connection with the scriptures. On September 24-25, we welcome Dr. Luke Timothy Johnson to Christ Church for two teaching events. Luke is a New Testament scholar, currently teaching at Candler School of Theology at Emory University. Some would cast him as the preeminent active NT scholar in the United States. I cast him as an old friend and one who inspired my love for the scriptures and the joy of biblical interpretation and study. I was one of the students on the search committee when Luke joined the faculty in Religious Studies at Indiana University. Before I completed my undergraduate degree in Religious Studies (1983), I was privileged to have an independent study course in Paul with Luke. He is a great teacher with a keen mind, a joyful heart, and a strong faith. *(continued on page 2)*

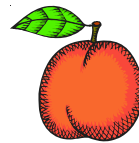

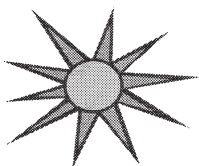


School Supplies Needed

The Cathedral Choir School mentoring program is seeking your help in providing back to school supplies for students in the low-income neighborhood of Brandywine Village in downtown Wilmington. Needed items include: *backpacks (without wheels), pocket folders, loose leaf paper, composition and spiral notebooks, pencils and pens (they especially like erasable pens), erasers (both large single erasers as well as pencil top size), glue sticks, scissors, rulers, index cards, colored pencils and markers, highlighters, pencil cases (to hold all these loose supplies), subject dividers for binders, sturdy binders (1", 1 1/2", 2"), poster board, and report covers*. 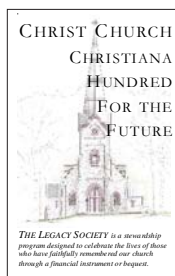
Acolyte Training

Study, Sup, and Serve

Rite-13 Service Trip to Harrisburg

The theme of the week was “More and Less.” For the 70+ teenage participants and their adult leaders, it was a week of sleeping on air mattresses on a church floor, showering in a college locker room, pitching in for cleaning and cooking chores, working in the community, and sharing the spirit and love of God.

Sarah Kirk, Jake Flanders, and Jack Kempner, along with Lynne Jensen and Marcy Kempner, participated in this Youthworks week of service in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania in June. Youthworks organizes service weeks for middle to high school students in 78 cities in North America. They believe that “short-term youth mission trips can bring life change to youth, a community, and the Church. Within a relatively short period of time, your own life and a stranger’s life can be powerfully changed through the desire to give to a community.” The Christ Church contingent was joined by church youth groups from Virginia, Ohio, and Michigan. Each day consisted of some service work in the community, some shared devotional and worship time, some chores around the church where we were staying, and a fun evening activity. The days were full and by lights out we fell onto our air mattresses and were asleep by the time our heads hit the pillow, until we were roused awake at 7 AM to start it all again.

Our crew’s service assignments were two days at Paxton House Ministry, a Christian-based residence for people with mental illnesses and developmental disabilities, and two days with Project SHARE, a food bank. We did weeding and manual labor, but it wasn’t all work. Our favorite parts of both jobs were getting a chance to meet and connect with the people we were serving—lunch with the residents at Paxton House, serving them root beer floats, helping Project SHARE clients weigh their produce and carry it out to their cars, adding that extra half gallon of milk to their bag. The people we met made an unforgettable impression on us. During our week in Harrisburg, we lived simply, cooking our own food, washing dishes, living out of a bag, and sleeping on the floor. We weren’t exactly living comfortably, but that made it easier for us to focus more on our work and Jesus and less on our material comfort. That brings us back to that theme—“More and Less.” Each day emphasized a different way to think about our lives and our faith—More Courage, Less Fear; More There, Less Here; More Jesus, Less Me.

From the Rite 13 Team: We want to start making a Youthworks service trip part of the Christ Church Rite-13 tradition. We will offer one every two years in the summer following the end of Rite-13 before the kids move up to J2A. So stay tuned for our next report in the summer of 2012! *Jack and Marcy Kempner*

Mission Trip to Jalonga

This work was not as simple as it sounds because we had to dig up wet clay dirt around the tree before the cement could be poured. It rained almost every day we were there, but our group worked as much as we could to leave the job site ready for the next day’s tasks. Again, we thank you all for your support throughout our journey, and we hope to receive the same support in years to come. *Maggie Moran*
