90-DAY BIBLE PRAYER CHALLENGE

Ninety Bible Passages. Ninety Days. Twenty Minutes. Once a Day. Last summer more than 170 parishioners set out to read the Bible cover to cover in 90 days. This was a speed read—an opportunity to swallow the whole Bible in one gulp. This summer we are going back to the Bible, and we are going deep. This is a slow read—an opportunity to savor portions of the Bible one bite at a time. Pray and reflect on one passage of Holy Scripture for 20 minutes once a day for 90 days and engage in the dynamic experience of going deep into God's Word, led by God's Holy Spirit. A Bible passage is provided for each day. Join us each week for discussion sessions either on Sundays from 9 to 10 AM or on Wednesdays from 12 to 1 PM in Parish Hall A.
