TODAY IS PALM SUNDAY

On this day, the church remembers when Jesus entered Jerusalem, cheered by those who hoped for the restoration of God's kingdom. We echo that joy in blessing palm branches and processing through the Church. Then the mood changes as we follow his journey to the cross. This whole story is called the Passion of our Lord, for its message is of his suffering, which offers us redemption from sin and death and gives new life in resurrection joy.

Christ Church Christiana Hundred and St. Barnabas' Episcopal Church will co-sponsor a screening of *The Philadelphia Eleven* on Wednesday, May 1, at 6 PM in Christ Church's Parish Hall. In an act of canonical disobedience, a group of women and their supporters organized their ordination to become Episcopal priests in 1974. The Church of the Advocate in Philadelphia welcomed them, but change was no small task. After the ordinations, the women experienced hostility as well as encouragement. This feature-length documentary tells the story of these women who succeeded in building a movement that transformed the Church. One of the Philadelphia Eleven, the Rev.
